Severe Weather Arrangements



The Headteacher of Fernhurst Junior School and I meet regularly to discuss joint issues, including severe weather procedures. We sincerely hope that a reoccurrence of the heavy snow that we have had in recent years does not happen, and would like to reassure parents/carers that all measures are taken to avoid closure where possible, such as regular servicing of heating systems and stores of grit and salt. The most important factor in making this decision is ensuring the children's safety with adequate supervision, as both schools now have a large number of staff who live outside the city.

We will try to let parents/carers know of a closure as soon as practically possible, and for this reason, it is vital that contact numbers are up to date so that we can text you.

Contact Details

Following on from the above note, please can I ask parents/carers to ensure that you keep us up to date with any changes to addresses or telephone numbers, including those of your emergency contacts. This is particularly important in the case of an emergency or if your child becomes unwell.

Coats

Please can parents/carers remember to ensure that children bring a coat into school every day, as at this time of year the weather is so changeable.

Collecting Children

We must be given the details of adults collecting children at the end of the day if they are different to the normal arrangements. If you know in advance that you may be late to collect your child, please contact the office to let us know so that we can reassure your child.
