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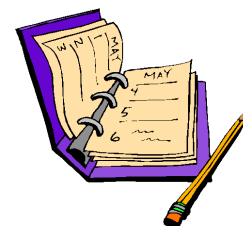

Attendance, Unauthorised Absence & Lateness



The Governors and I are very worried about the high number of children whose attendance is causing concern, particularly those children who have lots of odd days off or unexplained absences. Parents **MUST** email or telephone the school office on every occasion that their child is absent from school, otherwise this absence will be recorded as unauthorised and may lead to a fixed penalty fine.

Please also ensure that you arrive on time. The doors open at 8:40am and **school starts at 8:45am.**

When your child arrives late, it not only means that they are missing important learning time, but they are also disrupting the rest of the class and it is distressing for them too. Please also note that if you arrive after the register closes, this results in that morning session being marked as an unauthorised absence for your child.

Listening to Your Child Read

Please can I ask that you spend 5-10 minutes each day listening to your child read their school reading book. Practising regularly not only helps them to develop their enjoyment and confidence with reading, but also improves their decoding, fluency, understanding and expression. If you would like any help with this, please speak to your child's class teacher.

Please can I ask parents/carers to ensure that you keep us up to date with any changes to addresses or telephone numbers. This is particularly important in the case of an emergency or should your child become unwell.
